Kindle Cover Materials List

The Original Kindle standard measurements:
8" H * 5.3" W * 0.8" D

Cut the following pieces from your fabric:

Pocket:	9" x 7"	11 ?" x 7"
Lining Fabric:		9 ?" x 7"
Outer/Main Fabric:		2" x 7"
Outer addition:		(2) 11" x 7"
Fusible Fleece:

The iPad standard measurements:
9.56" H x 7.47" W x 0.53" D

Cut the following pieces from your fabric:

Pocket:	10" x 7"
Lining Fabric:	13 ?" x 9"
Outer/Main Fabric:	11 ?" x 9"
Outer addition:	2" x 9"
Fusible Fleece:	

Notions That We Used

- 7" RIRI Zipper
- D-Ring
- Magnetic Closure
- Thread
- Coordinating Thread (for top stitching)
- Contrasting Fabric (upper band)
- Outer fabric
- Lining fabric
- Fusible Interfacing
- Fusible Fleece
- Thread snips
- Point (Corner) Turner

1. Assemble Pocket:

- Place fabric right sides together, stitch together leaving a 3" opening on one side
- Turn fabric right side out and edge stitch to close the 3" opening
- Attach zipper to the long side of pocket
- Zipper Pocket is complete!

2. Assemble D-Ring Attachment Loop:

- Measure 2" x 4" piece of fabric
- Fold in half and iron
- Open and fold each outer edge towards the crease
- Fold once more, to finish with a tab piece that measures 1" wide x 2" length

3. Assemble Lining:

- Fold and iron down ?" of the upper fabric edge
- Adhere fusible fleece to the lining piece
- Measure 1" down from the center of each lining piece, and mark.
- Insert the magnetic closure at each 1" marking
- Place fabric right-sides together, stitch ? around leaving an opening at the top

4. Assemble Outer/Main Fabric:

- Fold and iron down ?" of the upper fabric edge
- Attach the outer upper fabric addition to outer/main fabric panel; Place right sides together and sew
- Adhere interfacing to outer/main fabric and the attached upper addition
- Place fabric right-sides together, stitch ? around leaving an opening at the top
- On the final long edge, insert the loop tab and D-ring at the top corner, secure, and stitch.

5. Put It All Together

- Turn lining right side out (so that the magnets won't clasp together) and insert your outer fabric into the lining. Both fabrics should have wrong sides together.
- Edge stitch along the top to attach the two pieces together.
- Turn the fabric so that the main/outer fabric is on the outside
